










## **HONG KONG MARITIME WEEK 2019**

### Hong Kong Maritime Week covers 8 themes



# Hong Kong's vibrant maritime cluster attracts new blood to the maritime industry

Various tertiary institutions and professional bodies in Hong Kong are offering maritime-related programmes and training courses to students and industry practitioners. The Government also attaches great importance to the manpower development of the maritime industry. A total of \$300 million were injected into the Maritime and Aviation Training Fund (MATF) in 2014 and 2019 to operate training and incentive schemes, sponsorships and scholarships. Through these schemes and trainings, MATF aims to attract more young talents to join the industry and build up a vibrant, diversified and competitive pool with professional and technical talents thus enhance the overall capability and professionalism of the maritime industry.

We have invited two young maritime industry practitioners to share their work experience and insight on the industry's development. They have received funding support from the MATF to participate in the 28th Asian Shipowners' Association Annual General Meeting held in Bangkok in May 2019.

## Ms. Orra Li, Claims Executive of China P&I Services (Hong Kong) Ltd.



Orra obtained a dual bachelor's degree in Logistics and Supply Chain Management in Shanghai and Australia, and then pursued a master degree in Hong Kong. "I started my career in the shipping agency sector during my summer internship and reckon that the Government has been giving continual support to the development of the maritime industry and encouragement to young people on pursuing their careers in the industry. In light of the highly international and diversified nature of the maritime industry, as well as the wide spectrum of services and challenging roles being covered by the industry, I determinedly pursued my career in the maritime field after graduation," said Orra.

Orra is currently working at China P&I Club and handling claims. China P&I Club provides its members (ship owners and ship management companies) a variety of marine insurance protection and professional services, including Protection and

Indemnity (P&I), Hull & Machinery, Freight, Demurrage and Defence (FD&D), Charterers Liability, etc. It aims to safeguard the prestige and interests of its members. Her duties are to monitor the entire claim handling process and progress, communicate and coordinate with members, claimants, surveyors and lawyers, etc.

In May this year, Orra participated in the 28th Asian Shipowners' Association Annual General Meeting in Bangkok as funded by MATF. She expressed her gratitude to the Hong Kong Shipowners Association and MATF for the given opportunity to attend the meeting as a member of the Young Shipping Executives' delegation. Orra learnt much from the meeting, at which a wide range of topical issues and challenges in the maritime industry were discussed, including the concern for the mental health of seafarers. The meeting also provided her with an excellent platform to connect with relevant industrial experts from all over the world and she was greatly enlightened. The meeting definitely reinforced her determination to develop her career in the maritime industry.

Excited by its diversity and challenging nature, Orra will continue to pursue her lifelong career plan in the maritime industry. ## Ms. Vincci Choi, Senior Claims Executive of Wah Kwong Shipping Agency Co. Ltd.



Vincci majored in International Shipping and Logistics Management at the university and has always been aspiring to become a maritime professional working with practitioners from all over the world. She joined the marine insurance sector after graduation and is currently working in the P&I department of a shipping company. Extensive and professional knowledge of the maritime industry, such as maritime law, ship chartering, ship finance, etc. is required for her current role.

Although she is still green in the industry, she appreciated that the Government and her company have given her many opportunities to get equipped and reach out different people around the world for communication and cooperation on different claim cases and daily operation of the vessels. Since each claim case involved

different aspects of the maritime industry, she was able to grasp industry knowledge across many disciplines quickly and handle claims from different perspectives, which would definitely help develop her future career.
