MARITIME PROFESSION – Engineering Crew (Seagoing Vessels)

Host : Seafaring used to be popular for many people to make a living But nowadays, this occupation has mostly been forgotten
People only focus on immediate interest and quick money and forget "no pain, no gain"
Only by working hard can we truly bring ourselves fortune

Host : Are there still young people working as seafarers in Hong Kong? Definitely! I found two youngsters working on seagoing vessels Sing (Sing, Engineering Crew, Seagoing Vessels) and Kin (Kin, Engineering Crew, Seagoing Vessels) to introduce the work on seagoing vessels for us

Host : What were the reasons for you to join this industry?

Sing: I majored in business subject And I have done office work for about a year I thought the prospect was not as good as I had expected I found that I can obtain professional qualifications in a relatively shorter period of time in seafaring Therefore I further studied mechanical engineering which met the entry requirement to start my career

Host: What about you, Kin?

Kin: My case is a bit different from Sing I majored in mechanical engineering

But I did not decide which sector to work in yet Later, from a maritime-related career seminar I learnt that the promotion path and prospect in seafaring were quite clear What's more, I wanted to see the world so I decided to develop a seafaring career

Host : What are the requirements to start a seafaring career (engineering crew)?

Sing : You have to complete the related maritime training courses Taking engineering department as an example: after completing the mechanical engineering course pre-approved by the Marine Department you need to get 12-month sea time and combined workshop skills training Then you can take the examination of Certificate of Competency (Marine Engineer Officer) Class 3 You may then serve as an Engineering Watchkeeping Officer

Sing : The daily work of a cadet includes checking oil cylinders and the operation of machines such as generators, main engine, boilers and so on According to the instruction from the Engineer Officers we assist in daily repair and maintenance

Kin : I am an Engineering Watchkeeping Officer My main duties are checking the operation of the machines on the vessel and conducting maintenance work with reference to the records In addition, I also manage the stock of spare parts of the vessel The Chief Engineer may deploy us to inspect or maintain other machines If necessary, we also go on deck for machine repairing

Host : What are the highest rank of deck and engineering departments?

Kin : The highest rank of the engineering department is the Chief Engineer The highest rank of the deck department is the Captain

Host: What about the salary?

Kin: he monthly salary is at least HK\$70,000 to HK\$80,000

Host: Do seafarers have to know how to swim? If someone is not good at swimming, can he become a seafarer?

Sing : Of course, he can But it is better if he knows how to swim. However, you do not have many chances to get into the sea Instead, you have to know survival skills For example, we must first learn fire prevention and firefighting security, first aid and usage of rescue boats before working on the vessel After getting on board, we also have routine trainings and drills of these items every month

Host: What do you think of the prospect of this industry?

Sing: I think it looks promising As we understand as long as you pass the examinations and obtain the related qualifications the promotion path and salary increment are quite clear With one step ahead your salary will be increased within a certain range Kin : Referring to my case, as an Engineering Watchkeeping Officermy salary is already three times of what I got as a cadetAnd it took me about three to four years to promote to my current position

Host : It is pretty fast I am particularly interested in your daily life on the vessel Because once you get on board it will take quite some time for you to return How is your life on board?

Sing: I work with Filipino crew The Engineering Watchkeeping Officer likes to play table tennis with me After that, we can take a rest in our own rooms Or if they want to sing karaoke we will go to the rest area and listen to their songs

Host : Can you get connected to the internet on board?

Sing: I am quite lucky WIFI is available on the vessel I work on I can use the instant messaging applications and keep in touch with my friends In addition, upon berthing if I can find the post office I will try to send post cards and letters to my friends

Host : In fact, this occupation allows you to go to many different places Where have you been?

Kin: I have been to all the five continents basically as well as some special placesSuch as the Panama Canal, the Suez CanalThe sceneries in the Pacific Ocean and Alaska are very fascinating! Host : Great! I do think your friends of the same age have yet been to these places So Sing, you must have sent a lot of post cards

Sing : Indeed My friends have received quite a lot

Host : Seafaring is not an easy job You cannot attain the highest level in one step It is really not easy to leave your hometown When you feel lonely, look at the endless sky and move on with conviction. As long as you work hard you will absolutely succeed someday
